


STRABISMUS

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- To develop normal vision your child needs two healthy eyes that are straight and line up with each other.
- Your child's eye(s) are not straight and do not line up correctly.
- Some children are born with this condition and sometimes it is caused by an illness or accident.
- It is very important for your child that this problem be treated now.
- The eye doctor may decide your child needs to wear eye glasses, a patch, or use eye drops, or have surgery, or do eye exercises to correct this problem.
- Follow-up visits with the eye doctor are very important for your child.

The vision condition that your child has is 'strabismus'.




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Frequently Asked Questions

What should I do if my child loses or breaks their eye glasses?

Contact the store or office where your child last got their eye glasses.

What should I do if my child's insurance doesn't cover eye glasses and I can't afford to buy them for my child?

Contact the health manager or school nurse at your child's school for programs that can help.

How often should my child see the eye doctor?

This is different for each child. Ask your child's eye doctor how often to schedule appointments.

Will my child grow out of needing eye glasses?

This is different for each child. Ask your child's eye doctor.

Will my other children need eye glasses too?

Vision problems are common in children. Check with your child's eye doctor.
